At that meeting, we were largely focused on how to use new technology (then very new) to try and build and sustain a network of people interested/concerned about 'inclusion' – when money was going to be hard to get – so altho' face-to-face encounters were the preferred choice, the question was – what can we do – even on limited budgets to not be isolated – and to build the movement?
